





As we suffer through this eternal winter it helps to hear the voice of this optimistic, eleven-year-old girl who reminds us that the sun will come out tomorrow. You can rest assured that you are going to leave here feeling warm and hopeful. I can hardly find the words to express how proud and grateful I am to have spent the past three months working with these young artists and getting to know them. This cast of 73 is made up of writers, dancers, painters, gymnasts, dreamers and more. They are full of spirit and so much creativity. While trying to keep up with them, I have been blessed by their joy and positivity, just as Mr. Warbucks discovers the same things in Annie.

The message of Annie is not about going from rags to riches. It is about how human connection is more important than money. It is that we can find hope and joy through building relationships. 




